

Workshop Title (Accreditation Module*): International Research Training Partnerships

*(*this workshop forms a compulsory module for participants undertaking the ARMS Foundation Level Accreditation program. It is not restricted to ARMS Foundation level program participants – others are welcome to attend).*

Workshop Overview:

The purpose of this module is to provide an insight into the current and evolving practices of international research training, including:

- ✓ An understanding of how research training informs partnerships, the required processes, activities and authorities needed to underpin these partnerships agreements;
- ✓ An understanding of the types of international research training partnerships, their value to the university, scholarships, demands on and needs of the sector, and evolving markets;
- ✓ An understanding of domestic and international requirements needed for international research training partnership models; and
- ✓ An understanding of the reporting and tracking requirements, including quality assurance, needed for international research training partnerships and candidates undertaking them.

Workshop structure

Presentation and small group discussion.

Experience level/ target audience

This module is suitable for senior research administrators, academics, research managers and Associate Deans wishing to update their knowledge in this area. It would also be suitable for junior research administrators wishing to progress their career. It is recommended that this module be taken in conjunction with the *Research Higher Degree Scholarships* module.

Learning objectives:

After completing this module, participants will be able to:

- Identify appropriate levels of international partners for higher degree research training and how agreements are used to formalise these;
- Identify international target markets which are strategic for your university;
- Develop partnership models, including Jointly Badged, Dual award (includes Cotutelle), and Sandwich PhD programs, as well as models to facilitate visiting international PhD scholars; and
- Monitor the progress of international research training candidates and agreements.
